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From General Sir Horace Smith-Dorrien to Chief of the Imperial General Staff

(No. S.D. 1035.)

22nd January, 1916, 11.30 p.m.

I received a telegram from Tighe to-day saying that Longido was occupied on 21st January. There was no opposition, though heavy rain rendered the advance arduous. Malleson occupied Mbuyuni this morning with 4 battalions and 18 guns. The opposition was slight. I have instructed Tighe to strengthen both places beyond the possibility of their being recaptured by the enemy.
