From General Sir H. Smith-Dorrien to War Office

(No. S.D. 1050.)

20th January, 1916 5.30 p.m.

It is reported by General Tighe on 24th January that a small force of the enemy was holding Serengeti Camp, 4 miles west of Mbruyuni. The Vol Brigade drove them out and the camp has been occupied as a detached fort. Mbruyuni is being thoroughly entrenched beyond possibility of re capture.
