My dear Harcourt

An old friend of mine,  
W. Atch, has been turned out  
of Mombasa by military au-  
thority & brought back to Eng-  
land with his family.

There was no ostensible case  
against him whatever. He had  
not only acted quite loyally he  
had organised a native town-guard  
to overcome difficulties about  
unemployed native labour.

But as a barrister, both in  
respect of fighting cases for

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native & was representing when  
he had been successful several  
times against a certain big  
local business corporation.

There is, I fear, grave reason  
to suspect that it was the  
influence of this corporation &  
for the military commandant  
order the deportation.

Pitak is, to the best of my  
belief, a strictly conscientious  
honorable man. It has applied  
to have his case reconsidered  
here, but gets no decision.

Mrs. [unclear] & his family are in  
serious distress, and in effect  
starvation.

At present he had a practice  
about £2000, built up in  
little over a year. Here, under  
present circumstances he can  
earn nothing.

Could you give his case  
your critical consideration  
now. I presume it comes under  
your control.
