Sir,

I am directed by the Secretary of State for the Colonies to inform you that, subject to your being passed as physically fit for service, he proposes to select you for probationary appointment as

Assistant to the Government Analyst  
in the East Africa Protectorate

with salary at the rate of £400 p.a. In the event of your appointment being confirmed at the end of the probationary period of three years your salary will rise by annual increments of £20 to £500 p.a. First class passage to and from the Protectorate are provided by the last Memorandum showing the general conditions attached to appointments in the Protectorate, and the leave and passage regulations for civil officers are enclosed herewith; but you are to understand that you will be subject to any regulations which may hereafter be introduced by or with the sanction of the Secretary of State. Your attention is invited to paragraph 16 of the memorandum African No. 973, as to the provision of Government quarters. A copy of the regulations as to pensions and a copy of the Colonial Regulations are also enclosed.

3. If you are prepared to accept the appointment on these conditions, you should present yourself to one of the medical advisers of this Department, whose names are given on the enclosed letter, for the purpose of being medically examined. The letter is to be left with him, and you will be required to pay him a fee of one guinea. He will send his report direct to this Department.
