Record Office are dealing with the Rhodesian Regiments, as distinct from the British Regiments. We receive the direct telegrams from the Rhodesian agent, but rely upon our copies of the C.O.'s lists.

Please also advise us of any other changes in the relations between the Rhodesian Regiments and the British Regiments. The first of them has been notified by G.O. in any future cases. Any notices need be sent to us?

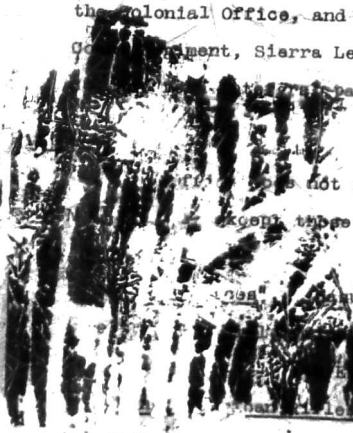

Casualty Telegrams from East and West Africa.

(1) WEST AFRICA.

Colonial Office require to have copies of all telegrams relating to casualties among Officers. (45/E.F./1879).

The West African Frontier Force is administered by the Colonial Office, and the Nigeria Regiment, Gold Coast Regiment, Sierra Leone Battalion, and Gambia Battalion are parts of it.



do not require copies of any telegrams except those relating to the Rhodesian

casualties - and wired by Governor. The Colonial Office deals only with these. (45/E.F./1879).

Rhodesian Regiment. (Casualties are also wired to the Colonial Office).

Though administered by the Colonial Office, the War Office answers enquiries and publishes casualties. (45/E.F./1879)

The King's African Rifles comprises :

- 1st - Central Africa Battalion.
- 3rd - East Africa Battalion.
- 4th - Uganda Battalion.

South African Troops.

The South African Record Offices in London and Pretoria are to deal with casualties in "all the Contingents of the Union of South Africa" (in Central and East Africa). 45/27/1879 A
