We had not, I think, sent D<sup>r</sup> Shicore to the Course in view of his seniority, and of the fact that he would require a further extension of his leave.

D<sup>r</sup> Eldred (File 2852) was informed by me a few weeks ago (before we had opened negotiations with the Lond. School) that the course would probably not be arranged in time for him to attend.

He has commenced a course of instruction on his own at the Lond. Sch. of Exp. Med (see  $\frac{2852}{23}$ ) and is asking whether fees and allowances will be paid.

In the circumstances, I think we had better let him attend the V. D. Course on his next leave, as the course which he has commenced does not end until June 3. His withdrawal from the course would no doubt be inconvenient to him and the School. (I have minuted in File 2852, on the question of granting fees and allowances for his course).

The fees for your tuition will be paid on your behalf by the Crown Agents for the Colonies, Whitehall Gardens, S.W., on your signing with them an agreement by which you will be liable to repay them in the event of your failing to obtain at the end of the course a certificate showing that you have satisfied the authorities of the School with regard to your regularity of attendance, progress, and proficiency, or of your failing to return to your appointment or relinquishing it within one year of the date of your next arrival in the ~~Colony~~ <sup>Protectorate</sup> for any other reason than mental or physical infirmity.

4. In order to obtain the certificate referred to in the preceding paragraph, you will be required to undergo any examinations which the authorities of the School may consider necessary for the purpose.

5. If on the completion of your course you duly qualify as above, you will be allowed the amount of your railway fare first class from your place of residence to the School at the beginning of the course and back again on its conclusion, and, if it has been necessary for you to sleep away from your place of residence in order to take the course, an allowance of 2s. 6d. a night towards your lodging expenses, but no other expenses in respect

With reference to my despatch No. 3372 of the 15th of May 1913, I have the honour to inform you that

the course of instruction in the treatment of Ven. Dis. which was arranged at the Royal Military Hosp., Rochester Row, has been found to be unsatisfactory and has been discontinued.

2. The authorities of the Hospital found it impossible to arrange a systematic course of instruction, owing to the irregularity of the supply of candidates for the course; and I was unable to pay sufficient attention to the instruction of individual officers, for the time at their disposal. Further instruction at the R.M.H.

can only be given to Colonial M.O's from October to January inclusive.

The School undertake to hold classes at any time of the year except the months of March, August or September. The fee for the course is £5-5-0. Examinations will be held and Certificates granted, as in the case of the Course which all M.O.'s are required to take at the London S.T.M.

4. I propose that the same allowances should be granted to officers attending this Course as are granted to those attending the course at the London S.T.M., with the addition of special training allowances at the rate of 5/- per diem for any part of the course during which an officer may be on <sup>drawing</sup> half salary. This special allow<sup>ance</sup> is referred to under heading

5. 6. Examinations will be held and certificates granted as in the case of the Lond. S.P.M., and the payment of fees and allowances will be made to depend on success in the exam.

7. The allowances to be granted are as follows:-  
2/6 a fortnight towards the cost of lodging  
1<sup>st</sup> class railway fares between an officer's place of residence and the School at the beginning and end of the course.  
A special training allowance of 7/- a day for any part of the course during which an officer is drawing half-pay.

require all M.O.'s who are  
not holding posts of an

The question is therefore  
which of ~~the~~ <sup>four</sup> possible  
courses should be adopted.

① It might be assumed  
that all M.O.'s not holding special  
posts will wish to take the  
course sooner or later. This is  
generally speaking, the practice  
adopted in the case of the  
short course in entomology. A M.O.  
coming on leave who has not  
taken the course is usually  
(in the absence of special reasons  
to the contrary) invited to take  
it. In addition to the payment  
of fees the lodging allowance  
of 2/6 a night, the training  
allowance of 5/- a day for  
the period of instruction is also  
given. The cost should

decide what Mr. shall be  
required to take the course  
during their next leave, &  
inform them some accordingly.  
In this case also the training  
allowance of 5/- a day would  
be given.

(3) As in the case of the  
DPH, an officer would not  
be required to obtain the prior  
assent of Govt. in taking  
the course during his leave, but  
it being assumed that it is to  
the advantage of Govt. that is  
may be taken by officers as far as  
possible, but that it should be left  
to the individual officer to decide.

(4) It could be treated as an
