20th July, 1916, 2.30 p.m.

Your No. 57912 of 5th June. I am sending the 101st Commanders to Egypt to replace the 57th Rifles, as it has not been found possible to relieve the 29th Punjab from East Africa.

Repeated to General Officer Commanding-in-Chief, Egypt.

## OPERATIONS

*From the 1st to the 31st of July 1966*

1st July 1966

After the withdrawal of Muanza's troops pursued as far south as Imungu near the southern end of Starbu's Sector, while SA 7 Windford went in search of the enemy's base Muanza. At Great Pier near the end of the Sector, the Muanza and SA 7's Home 1 were found settled. A large quantity of small arms and some ammunition, but no the C-47, and 4 boxes of supplies, together of enemy weapons and blacks were also captured later on. No difficulty is presented by the salvage of the ships.

The enemy is now being driven completely off the Lake Victoria-Nyanza area and is moving towards Talora.

Various divisions are moving from the line between Imungu to Dodoma road at K... on the Central Railway. Have now driven several miles south of the river... and three or four enemy non-combatants who were west of Tangwani to Tangwani have and have been taken... The rains... are being reported.
