THE MERCHANT SEAMAN DISCIPLINE BILL, 1917.

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The purpose of the Merchant Seaman Discipline Amendment Ordinance, 1917, is to bring the law relating to the Discipline of Merchant Seamen into line with the provisions in the United Kingdom the same matter contained in the Defence of the Realm Regulation 29 (a) as amended by the Order in Council of the 29th November, 1916.

2. The Bill has been drafted in accordance with the instructions contained in the Secretary of State's Circular of the 26th February, 1917, and may in my opinion be assented to without further reference here.


