SEVENTH DAY ADVENTIST MISSION

States now working in South Kavirondo District of Nyanza Province, and there is at present no reason to be dissatisfied with their conduct. Military authorities however state that all their information points to fact that they are undesirable owing to pronounced sympathies with Germany and tendency to create unrest. Strongly of opinion that no enemy subject should be allowed to enter Prot as member of any mission, after :

On this subject we can now inform Mr Campbell in continuation of our letter of the 24th of July (1916) that the members of the mission, who are not of enemy nationality have been permitted to return to their stations in the East Africa Protectorate, and that the mission is now working in the South Kavirondo district of the Nyanza Province. We told Mr Meredith on 25th that "in the meantime" (that is, pending the receipt of information as to whether the mission ^{was} still operating in the East Africa Protectorate) Mr Longest was not prepared to assist him in obtaining a passport for the purpose of visiting the Protectorate. Mr Campbell, who has taken up the correspondence in the place of Mr Meredith, has not mentioned the question of a passport. We need not do so either. If, on the receipt of the latter proceedings, he asks for a passport, it should certainly be refused until the war concludes.

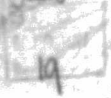
