Mr Gosling's memorandum tallies with the arrangements as reported to us by Mr Byatt in 34033 and 27348.

I acknowledge receipt, approving of the arrangements made and say that the Secretary of State has learned with much satisfaction that the Officer Administering the Government has been able to assist Mr Byatt in this emergency.

(I suggest this because it seems a good deal to Mr Byatt that the E.A.P. authorities are well disposed towards him. In a private letter to me Mr Bowring expressed great readiness to do all that he could to help Mr Byatt, but I am not so sure from my conversations with Sir Henry Belfield that the Governor himself was equally ready to do so when he was out there.)
