" 590 September 6th. Your telegram 31st August
produce referred to in my telegram 29th ^{August} July included
all commodities not ranking as priority such as coffee
beans and flax particularly former. It was thought that
as concession of 500 tons apparently intended as a
help to local producers this Government would be in
best position to decide allocation. Believe that
private companies are approaching shipping controller
with objects of obtaining space for cargo in which they
are interested and thereagain this should not be allowed.
All such representations should come through this
Government. Arrangements in your telegram 20th July
would operate harshly in some cases as preference to
coffee in transit 23rd February somewhat arbitrary
and prejudicial to growers curing on own plantations.
Will be grateful for whole last year's crop could be
treated as one proposition giving preference to those
producing 10 tons or under and alletting fixed propor-
tion to remainder total to be neighbourhood 3000 tons
Uganda to have fifty per cent.
