Mr. Bottomley.

Hold up this telegram until we receive a  
reply from the War Office and Treasury as regards the  
proposal that all officers of the local forces when on  
leave in this country and drawing Army rates of pay  
should receive in addition ration allowance of 1/9d a day.  
We suggested <sup>to Treasury</sup> that the proposed grant <sup>of</sup> ration allowance  
should date from September 1st, 1917, <sup>and</sup> should be  
retrospective. <sup>before last date</sup> If this is accepted <sup>it</sup> will not help  
Captain E. F. Allen who returned to East Africa in the  
middle of May, but we can consider whether any exceptions  
should be made as regards <sup>to date of</sup> dating the new arrangements  
~~from September 1st, 1917~~, when we receive the Treasury  
reply.
