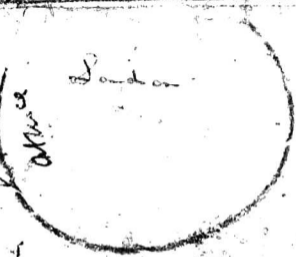

EXTRACT FROM A LETTER FROM G.S.O. - FORCE INTELLIGENCE.

RE: DEATH OF HONY. LIEUT. J. LOGAN.

"From unofficial verbal information received from Flag Trustee from Nurungu 24/8/17, it appears that Lieut. Logan was killed at Hussein Kilondolo Hill to the S. E. of Nurungu on night of 12/13 August. From description given the enemy buried an Englishman on that date who answers to Lt. Logan's appearance and dress, and we had no other patrol there at that time. So there can be no doubt of his death."
