
Sir

I have the honor to report that I have this day examined Miss Miss M.G. Burn, East Africa Nursing Service, and she still has slight pains from the floating kidney. She has much improved but as with any heavy nursing work the pains would be more severe and might disable I am of opinion that return to duty is not advisable in the tropics for a prolonged period. As the muscular relaxation in England is less than the tropics an earlier return to work here might be possible.
