Mr. Butler
Captain Webb-Morris has called and discussed this at some length. His one anxiety is to get back to his home in East Africa, ~~whether~~ as a soldier or, if necessary, after discharge. The difficulty, as I pointed out to him, that Dr. Low says that he is at present quite unfit to return to East Africa as a soldier while his report is not sufficiently definite to justify us in discharging him at once (in which case he could return to East Africa or go wherever he wished).

I think there is nothing for it (and Captain Webb-Morris more or less agreed) but to give him an extension on Army rates of pay (12/6 a day) until the middle of July (July 15) and to have him re-examined by the Medical Adviser towards the end of June in the hope of deciding definitely then whether (a) there is a reasonable prospect of his being fit to return to East Africa soon or (b) whether he must be discharged as definitely unfit.

? Tell Captain Webb-Morris that it has been decided as suggested above and that a further letter to the Medical Adviser will be sent him towards the end of June. S.R. to note.

(2) Inform Crown Agents of extension.

(3) Send to the Governor, with reference to previous correspondence, copy of 19629 and of proposed letter to Captain Webb-Morris.

I see that his claim for medical attendance (19077) is not yet disposed of. I think he should have this. He is entitled to free medical attendance at a military hospital, but the circumstances of his illness made this impracticable. ? Tell him that the Crown Agents have been authorised to pay him this £6.16s.0d., and authorise the Crown Agents accordingly.

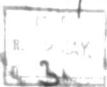
