Sw With reference to your letter of the 14th March
13420/1917 transmitting copies of telegrams from the Governors of
Uganda and the East Africa Protectorate, relative to the restriction
on the importation of Hides and Coffee, I am directed by the
Board of Trade to state, for the information of Mr. Secretary Long,
that untanned skins whether dressed or undressed if not manufactured
are not prohibited to be imported, but that tanned skins are pro-
hibited.

In regard to the importation of Hides, I am to state
that it is the present intention to grant licences for dried hides
over 8 lbs weight and dry salted hides over 12 lbs.

The question of the restriction of Coffee is at present
under consideration by the War Cabinet. Mr. Long is doubtless
aware that the present proposals if approved is for the admission
of half the crop.
