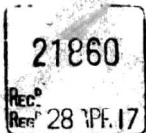

Sir,

I am directed by the Board of Trade to state that representations have been made to them respecting the hardship which would be inflicted on growers of coffee in Uganda and East Africa by a drastic enforcement of the recent prohibition of the import of coffee into the United Kingdom.

I am accordingly to suggest for Mr. Secretary Long's consideration that, in pursuance of a decision come to by Ministers, an intimation might now be conveyed to the Governments of the Protectorates concerned that H. M. Government will be prepared to treat as in transit and therefore to admit into the United Kingdom coffee which was already en route to the port of shipment at the date of the prohibition (February 23rd) providing that the amount so shipped shall not exceed 1500 tons.
