I am commanded by the Army Council to send you, for the information of Mr. Secretary Long, the enclosed copy of a telegram of 20th instant, from the General Officer Commanding in Chief, East Africa, regarding the proposed grant of a bonus to telegraphists in the Postal Service of the East Africa Protectorate.

Mr.Long will be aware from paragraph 88 of the Report of the Auditor on the accounts of military expenditure in the East Africa Protectorate for the period ended 31st March 1915 (copy enclosed with your letter 40996 of 31st August, 1916), that the cost of telegraph services rendered by the Uganda Railway in connection with the military operations has been charged to the common charges account, and credited to Railway funds, but that no charge has been made in respect of the cost of similar services rendered by the Protectorate Fost Office except that the pay of the additional staff above peace establishments has been charged to the common charges account.

The Council have no objection, in the circumstances explained in the telegram, to the common charges account being also charged with the cost of any bonus that may be approved in this case for the telegraphists in the Protectorate Postal Service as long as the bonus is necessitated by extra work due to military requirements and not by other considerations such as (e.g.) a general increase in local rates of wages or cost of living. If Mr.Long concors in wages or cost of living. If Mr.Long concurs in principle, the Council would be glad if he would consider the question of the appropriate rate of bomus to be given and inform the local Protectorate authorities by cable of his decision.

On receiving a copy of the instructions sent to the Protectorate authorities the Council will similarly inform the General Officer Commanding in Chief.
