Sir,

In reply to the Colonial Office letter of 30th April, 1918, 12148/1918, I am commanded by the Army Council to acquaint you that in view of the circumstances stated the will raise no further objection to the issue of gratuities under the provisions of Article 497 of the Royal Warrant for Pay and Army Orders 406 of 1916 and 303 of 1917, to the temporary officers of the local East African Forces (and of the Nyassaland Field Force).

The gratuities should be assessed at the precise amounts the officers would have received had they been on British rates.

As regards the non-commissioned officers and men, a gratuity limited to the rate admissible for a British soldier is also approved.
