I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of
your letter No. 28602/19 of the 10th of October last, transmitting
for our observations, copies of correspondence concerning the
administration of estates of persons dying in the East Africa
Protectorate.

(2.) Insolvent colonial estates, so far as we have to deal with them, are comparatively few, and we cannot recall another instance of creditors coming forward in this country after the available assets had been distributed in the Colony or Protectorate, as happened in the case of the late Mr Simpcox. On account of the delay which, as the Administrator General points out, would be involved, we do not think it advisable that notice should be given to creditors by means of advertisement in this country or in any other country outside the Protectorate, unless he has reason to suppose that there are creditors in such countries, with whom he cannot communicate in any other way.

3. We think it reasonable however, that the legal personal representative in this country should expect fuller information than is given in the account sent home in the case of Mr Simpson. I enclose a report on the first administration of the Gold Coast estate as a specimen of the practice of the Official Administrator in that Colony, though it is possibly rather fuller in some respects than may be considered necessary. I may mention also that it is frequently useful that we should know in this office how the balance of pay or salary is arrived at.

4. We have recently received instructions from the Government of the East Africa Protectorate to pay Mr Simpson the sum of £75. 6. 4 and a draft for this amount was sent to him on the 24th of October. Mr Simpson will thus be able now to meet the liabilities he mentions.
