My Lord,

With reference to Foreign Office despatch No. 106 Treaty (21955/C/116), dated 15th June 1919, regarding the proposal to employ Miss M. Robertson on the investigation of Surra (Camel Trypanosomiasis) in the Sudan, I have the honour, by direction of His Excellency the Governor General of the Sudan, to inform you that it has now been ascertained that the cost of Miss Robertson's scheme for research work in Camel Trypanosomiasis is estimated at not less than £ 2,700. It appears that a sum of between £ 3,000 and £ 4,000 spread over two years is a reasonable estimate, and that the Sudan Government is expected to defray this.

The Sudan Government is faced with greatly increased liabilities which necessitate the utmost economy in the coming year.

It is consequently very much regretted that the financial situation precludes the inception of any new scheme.
