Sir,

With reference to your letter No. 6688/1919 of 5th March, 1919, relating to the expenses incurred by Captain P.T.S. Maxsted, East African Local Forces, while undergoing treatment in the South of France, I am directed to inform you that no arrangements were made by this Office as to the expenses of Captain Maxsted's treatment (though it is not known whether any financial assistance was promised by the Red Cross). If he had been an officer of the British Army the expenses incurred by him would have been refunded up to a limit of £3.3.0 (Three guineas) weekly; while he remained on full pay and provided he was actually expending that amount on sanatorium treatment.

With reference to the last paragraph of your letter I am to inform you that nothing has been received from this officer since his letter of January 13th 1919, which was forwarded to you with War Office letter, number as above, M.S.1. Col. dated 29th January, 1919. If a communication is received it will at once be forwarded to you.
