Major Henderson's statement marked X gives part of the information here. The accounts seem to have been kept thoroughly careless. I am not certain whether Colonel or his money was at stake. I think the latter. Major Henderson belongs to the 17th Buffs (Indian) and appears to have been acting under the orders of the military authorities in P.A. We have no trace of him. It seems that we should refer the case back to the D.O. and let them go to the D.O. if they want to.

I reply sending back all enclosures marked in red; say we have no trace of Major H.; that as the ~~officer~~ ^{officer} appears to have been administered by the military authorities, the case would appear to be no for the concern of the A.C.
