With reference to your letter of 20th November, (41063/18) and subsequent enquiries concerning the case of W.C.W. Jones, late Lieut. British East Africa Force. I am directed by the Minister of Pensions to inform you that until this officer is admitted to a Sanatorium, the Ministry would award him an allowance at the rate of £78 a year in respect of expenses involved in the constant attendance of a second person. This allowance would be issued with his retired pay by the Assistant Paymaster General. You will no doubt issue instructions accordingly as from the 1st November, 1918.

The Ministry will be responsible for the payment of expenses incidental to treatment, and will receive from your Department.

The Minister is advised that Sanatorium treatment is required, and will endeavour to make arrangements accordingly. In the meantime, and in order to enable this officer to obtain extra diet required for his disability, the Ministry are awarding him an allowance at the rate of 15/- per week to start from November 1st. The officer has also been invited to forward, for the consideration of the Ministry, all duly receipted accounts incurred in the treatment of his invaliding disability since April 1917. Mr. Jones has been advised as to the foregoing arrangements.
