The Secretary of State for the Colonies announces vacancies for posts of Medical Officers in the following territories: East Africa Protectorate, Uganda, Nyasaland, Zanzibar, Somaliland.

The salary of a Medical Officer is on the scale of £1000 - £1200 - £1500 a year, with duty allowance of £25 - £25 - £600 a year, after six years service, £525 - £25 - £600 a year with duty allowance of £25.

The conditions of the appointment to these posts are as follows: The appointment of Medical Officers in the East Africa Protectorate - Senior Medical Officer at £1000 - £1250 - £750 duty allowance.

- Senior Sanitary Officer - £750 - £450 - £150 duty allowance
- Principal Medical Officer - £750 - £350 - £1000 duty allowance £85

Certain special appointments are possible as follows: Bacteriologist, as a Senior Medical Officer.

Assistant Bacteriologist, as a Medical Officer, higher scale  
Medical Sanitary Officer, as a Senior Medical Officer,  
Medical Officer of Health, graded as Medical Officer,  
except in Zangbar, when the Medical Officer of Health  
is graded as a Senior Medical Officer, and the Assistant  
Medical Officer of Health is graded as a Medical Officer.

The Principal Medical Officer in Nyaraland  
is graded as a Deputy Principal Medical Officer.

The Principal Medical Officer in Zangbar  
is graded as a Senior Medical Officer.

The Head of the Medical Department in  
Sawaliland is graded as a Senior Medical Officer.

Particulars as to leave and pensions may  
be had on application.

Medical Officers are permitted to take  
private practice on the understanding that they give  
precedence to their official duties.
