Sir,

I am directed by the Minister of Pensions to acknowledge your letter of the 15th ultimo (1491/1918-19) enclosing a copy of a despatch from the Officer Administering the Government of the East African Protectorate regarding a contribution by Mr. Abdul Rasul Allidina Visram for the benefit of the widows and orphans of British soldiers, European and Indian, who have fallen in the present war.

I am to request that you will convey to Mr. Abdul Rasul Allidina Visram the Minister's sincerest thanks on behalf of the Ministry of Pensions for this act of generosity towards the widows and children of those who have laid down their lives in the Empire's service.

I am further to state that the Minister concurs in the suggestion of the Secretary of State for the allocation of two-thirds of the amount to an Indian organisation and of the remaining one-third to a British organisation.

Provision for the welfare of children whose fathers have fallen in the war has been made in part through the Special Grants Committee of the Ministry of Pensions, the Committee on a Bill for improving the supervision of the health of children, and in a number of other ways. It is of great value. The Minister accordingly warmly commends subject to the approval of Mr. Secretary Allidina Visram, the Administration of the balance of the generous gift (after making the selection to a suitable Indian organisation) be entrusted to the Special Grants Committee of the Department, who are in constant touch with the Local Pensions Committees, with the official machinery throughout the United Kingdom, and are in a position to give in each case, how a supplementary grant may most profitably be spent in the interests of the individual child.

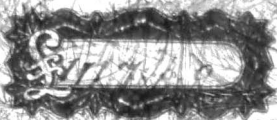
