2. A deduction of £5 should be made
 in respect of the sum for the above ^{and} shall
 Cunningham and will be ^{paid} to the ^{proper} ^{authorities}
 17th of March

3. In the event of Mrs Cunningham's remarriage her pension, but not that of her child (provided the child still depends on her)

are released to from the date of such remarriage, and

Mr Cunningham will become entitled to an additional $\frac{1}{2}$ a week in attaining the age of 45 years, subject to the proviso set out in the preceding para.
