Sir. I have the honour to request ~~that~~ permission to draw my pay for February 1914 if possible to date in terms of my last pay certificate handed to your Office to-day — and that the Advance of £60 therein mentioned may be held over until my Quarterly for 1½ years last Service is drawn.

CERTIFIED that CAPTAIN E.H.A. PALMER has been fully paid up to  
31st January 1919, and is entitled to £400 (Four hundred pounds)  
per annum plus Colonial allowance of 6/- (three shillings) and  
Field Allowance of 3/6d (three shillings and sixpence) per diem  
to End February 1919, and thence forward at the rate of £400  
(four hundred pounds) per annum only to 4th March 1919, unless  
he is discharged from hospital before that date. In the latter  
instance he will cease to draw field pay and will draw pay at the  
rate of 15/6d (thirteen shillings and sixpence) per diem, rein-  
vigorating his commission on discharge from hospital.  
As a special case, on his being invalided to England, Captain  
Palmer has been given an advance of £60. 1. 6d (Sixty pounds  
one shilling and sixpence) representing pay at Infantry rates,  
from 1st February 1919 to 30th April 1919, recoverable from pay  
due, or from gratuity if necessary. Income tax charged to  
31st December 1918.
