

Hastings Thomson, No. 27782/1914.

Referring to your letter of 31st ulto. advising that a draft had been issued in favour of Mr. J. H. Thomson for the sum of £27:5:8; and that the Crown Agents had been instructed to pay this amount to Mrs. Hastings Thomson forthwith, we understand that Mrs. Hastings Thomson has now received the sum mentioned.

We beg your further consideration of the question whether an arrangement can not be made, whereby the Crown Agents would have power to advance to Mrs. Hastings Thomson some regular remittance, say monthly, towards her subsistence. We are assured the Crown Agents have no power to do so without instructions through the Colonial Secretary. The point is, it appears, from explanation made to us, that the East Africa Protectorate are late in sending money due and it is not possible for Mrs. Hastings Thomson to go on so many months without regular remittances to the support of herself and her family. We, therefore, venture to inquire whether it will be possible for you to instruct the Crown Agents to facilitate payment to Mrs. Hastings Thomson as suggested?
