It is with regret we venture to trouble you again in connection with the affairs of Mrs. J. Hastings Thomson. In the face of the close letter received from her today, however, and of the destitute state in which she and her family are meantime placed, it is impossible refrain from doing something to relieve this family. We most earnestly trust it will accord with your mind and convenience that immediate arrangement should be made for a payment to Mrs. Thomson. Whatever is the reason it is clear that the wife and family of a responsible servant of the Government is in a state of absolute destitution and it ought to be possible to relieve the situation and debit the servant with the cost. This is a case of undoubted hardship and we shall be much obliged if you will kindly inform us that pending investigation, some immediate relief is to be given.
