With reference to my despatch No. 842 of 30th October 1913, dealing with my visit to the Southern Masai Reserve, and more particularly to paragraphs 15 and 56 thereof, I have the honour to inform you that the Masai of the Khatonykye Tribal Division have now offered a sum of Rs. 10,450 which they desire to be utilized in improving the water supply in their country.

It is possible that further sum will be similarly contributed by other sections of the tribe, and additional funds may be raised for the benefit of the tribe from the proceeds of the sale of their cattle.

It has been suggested that the sum of Rs. 10,450 should be placed to a "Suspense" account and the proceeds...
