& your despatch
of the 27th of July you
suggested reconsideration of
some of the details of that
decision, & added that Mr.
van Someren, who was previously
on board the steamer of the 10th
of August, had been informed that

3. Mr. van Someren's departure
was postponed for five months &
in your letter No 1053 of the
29th of Dec. ^Brepeating that he

A. They recommended that

compensated in it for health.

B. They define the
duties of the post as the free
performance of ordinary (or
conservative) dental work for
all European Govt Officers,
including visiting Officers,
the performance, according to a
prescribed scale of charges,
of extraordinary (or prosthetic)
work for European Govt Officers,
as well as of all dental work
of all kinds for their wives &
families (including children to
the age of 15).

C. The holder of the
post should be allowed private
practice, as long as it does not
interfere with the discharge of
his Govt duties.

D. The salary of the
post should be at the rate of
£500, rising to £600 a year. The

scale should have effect, in the
 van Sommer case, as if it had
 been in force since the 1st of April,
 1913. The van Sommer Co
 paid arrears of salary, including
 the periodical increments, accordingly.
 E. It should be laid down

that only a very grave emergency
 would be held to justify taking
 the Yan Dental Surgeon away
 from the work attached

 material should be provided by the
