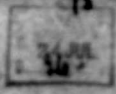

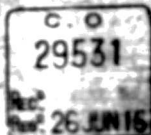

No. 229. Your despatch of 14th May No. 344 There is
apparently some misunderstanding in War Office letter
of May 8th. The Officers mentioned are actually
performing military duties in the field. General
Officer Commanding considers military rank essential
as officers concerned form part of military medical
organisation under the D.D.M.S. I agree and trust
you will move War Office to reconsider decision. No
request has been made on behalf of civil medical
officers who are performing their normal duties. The
same remarks apply also to case of veterinary officers.)
