3. The weeks spent were of the usual class and it was evidently never realized by the Agent in India that they were to have been used as weeks for天涯海角. In fact several of them refused to work for other than Hindoo.

4. The assumption was that all except the three posted to Indians were returned to India at once.

5. In view of the wording of the circular letter which limited the liability of the applicant for a sum of £1000/- per Doctor and distinctly stated that they would be brought out at Reimbursement expense, I expect now that any liability rests on the applicants mentioned in Appendix A to meet the expenses incurred in bringing them down or returning the weeks to India.

6. It appears to me that the whole responsibility rests with the late General Manager, Mr. Miles Taylor, who authorized the whole proceeding.

7. I should therefore be willing if you would instruct me so to do that I should contact the necessary funds to meet the expeditious payment under Appendix B.

I have the honour to forward you herewith two queries raised by the Auditor on expenditure which he considers should receive the sanction of the Secretary of State. The expenditure is certainly not of an ordinary character, and I therefore report the same to you for favour of the sanction necessary to enable the Auditor to pass these charges.

The history of the same is as follows:-

In February 1914 a representation was made to this office that owing to the difficulties in locally obtaining cooks, and the discomfort of the staff that naturally followed such men to be brought over from India, and hired to the staff, an addition of Rs. 5/- per man/men was to be made to cover the cost of passages. The matter was discussed at an official meeting, and agreed to, and a number of cooks were engaged through the Agents in India.

These they arrived there, were, unfortunately, useless and had to be returned, and it is in consequence of their return, and the habit that is raised on the cost of their passage that the present query has arisen.

The action taken was one that was common during construction, and it did not appear that when the late General Manager made the arrangements for these men there would be anything irregular, or to voice objection, in his action, till undertaken  
by the impossibility of the men object completely changed to  
the Government.

circumstance which incidentally is not very creditable to the agents in India, only three of them were employed at all and those only for a very short period. In these circumstances it does not appear possible to make any members of the staff responsible for any part of the cost incurred.

4. The proposal emanated from and was carried out by Mr.Taylor, the late General Manager, without authority, and he should in my opinion be debited with the cost, amounting to Rs.1,507.00. I should be glad to know whether this sum, or any portion of it, can be recovered from him. Should this be impracticable I see no other alternative than to accept the amount in question as a charge against Railway funds.

agency. When they arrived, none of them were compelled to cook for Europeans, and several refused to do so; others of them cooked for Hindus for periods varying from three to four months. They were all sent back to India, and the whole cost of the proceeding was £45/-<sup>1</sup>. If the D.S.C. had demanded the sum of £2597 it would be another deal with.

I do not think we can bring up Mr Taylor and tell him no longer in the same terms his irresponsible financial deals were one of the grounds on which his reduced re-appointment was based; consequently, he has, <sup>already</sup> for a sum, paid the penalty for this, amongst his other errors of the same kind. Finally, his pension is only £600 a year, and the sum in question is nearly £200.

I say that the amount must be made a charge against his salary for
