Sir,

I have the honour to transmit herewith for favour of consideration a claim for compensation for loss of kit submitted by Lieutenant C. P. G. Jones.

2. Lieutenant Jones was originally given a temporary commission in the Mombasa Indian Volunteer Corps and on the disbandment of that unit was attached to the 63rd Palancotta Light Infantry. He has now been invalided out of the service on the recommendations of a Medical Board.

3. The General Officer Commanding observes that Lieutenant Jones was in no way to blame for the loss of kit and considers that some compensation should be made
