Pollowing message for the British Reat African Corporation, Limited, London, from Mr. Cox of the Corporation, Mombasa:

"As, owing to fly and escarpments, the route beyond Kasindi is impracticable for mules, the arrangements have been altered as follows: all batteries, leads, donkeys, mules, cartridges, machine guns, medicaments and 897 perters left Kibale on June 25th and are new preceding direct to Mbarara for Rutshuru together with eleven officers, including Moulaert and two officers who have recently arrived from the Congo.
