The details of items charged to General expenditure (i.e.all except those included in the last item charged which will doubtless be accounted for elsewhere) cannot be regarded as sufficient. The articles are in the nature of trade goods and should be accounted for accordingly. "In store" is not sufficient information. It should be stated whom & for what purpose the articles are issued. Issues of rice, sugar, coffee, tea, kerosine oil, axes, hoes, salt, fish, meat, etc. would not be unusual. These particulars should therefore be present either in the lines of the Gen. G.A. minute No.10917/15 of 3.3.15 i.e. "containing on its merits".
