No. 387. With reference to your telegram 16th  
November paragraph No. 1 exportation of unwooled  
sheepskins already approved see your telegram 23rd  
February. Paragraph No. 2 presumption correct para-  
graph No. 3 etc., representations have been made  
that shippers are put to considerable expense in  
freight charges owing to necessity for shipping  
hides and skins intended for United States of America  
via United Kingdom. Consider that little risk will  
be incurred if hides and skins so shipped but trans-  
shipped at Genoa and Naples are consigned on through  
bills of lading through a Bank to a named consignee  
in the United States of America. Shippers should  
give bond to amount of treble value of goods for pro-  
duction of landing certificate from New York Customs  
within a certain time to be specified in the bond  
May I be furnished with list of reliable firms as  
consignees as has been apparently supplied to Aden.  
These remarks also extend to goatskins.
