I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your despatch No. 769 of the 21st of October in which you intimate that, owing to the shortage of staff in the Customs and Excise Department in London, the vacancies in the Customs Department in this Protectorate cannot be filled for the present.

2. I venture to observe that our local staff is considerably reduced owing to military requirements, and that it will not be possible for the Department to be efficiently administered unless the establishment is brought up to strength. I should therefore be grateful if the feasibility of transferring any available officers with experience in Customs work from other Colonies could be considered.
