THE CUSTOMS TARIFF AMENDMENT (NO. 3) ORDINANCE, 1915.

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STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

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The object of the Customs Tariff Amendment (No. 3) Ordinance, 1915, is to reduce the export duty chargeable on rubber other than plantation rubber to an ad-valorem duty of 4% and to remit any export duty on rubber planted on land granted in connection with a forest concession. To effect that purpose Section 2 of the Customs Tariff Amendment (No. 2) Ordinance of 1912 has been repealed and item No. 3 of Table II of the Customs Tariff Ordinance, 1909 has been reverted to with the reduction of the duty from 10% to 4%.

2. The alteration in the law has been made at the request of the Secretary of State vide his Confidential Despatch of the 14th October, 1915. The Bill is therefore, in my opinion, be assented to without further reference home.
