Sir,

With reference to your letter No 5237 E.A. of the 28th January respecting the departure of East African officers by the Messageries Maritimes steamer leaving Marseilles on the 4th February, we observe that we have been authorised to issue, to certain officers appointed to East Africa and Uganda after undergoing a course of instruction at the Imperial Institute, their allowances of £150 per annum to the 2nd February. We have done so and informed the Protectorate Governments accordingly, but, in view of your letter under reference I have to enquire whether such officers should be called upon to refund the difference between that allowance and the half pay of their appointments, (£125 per annum) for the 1st and 2nd February.
