Mr. Read,  
 I attach an Estimate of the amount which will  
 be required in 1916-17 for the cost of the audit of  
 the accounts of East Africa.  
 Subject to approval, I have included in this  
 Estimate the proposal that, as from the 1st April  
 next, the officer who is responsible for the details  
 in connection with the audit of the accounts of the  
 Uganda Railway should be raised from the rank of an  
 Assistant Auditor to that of a Senior Assistant  
 Auditor, with salary on the scale of £400 by £20 to  
 £500 - and Duty Pay of £40. In explanation of this  
 proposal I should mention that for some considerable  
 time I have been impressed with the large amount of  
 work and extra responsibility, as compared with the  
 ordinary duties of an Assistant Auditor, which fall  
 upon the officer who is permanently attached for the  
 Railway

Railway audit and I am convinced that in Mr. S. N. Faulkner, who has held this position for some years and who I recommend should be selected for the new post, the Department possesses an officer who is exceptionally well qualified in all respects for this additional responsibility - a view which is supported by the fact that, a few months ago (30889/15) the Manager of the Railway sought to obtain his services as an Assistant Chief Accountant on the Railway establishment. I consider that the present contribution by the Railway to the Protectorate (£2,900) is sufficient to bear the resulting small increase in the actual cost of the railway audit.
