With reference to your letter No. 7577/1915 of
the 18th instant, I am directed by Secretary Sir E.
Grey to state that the Italian Ambassador has been
informed of the instructions given for the release of
certain consignments of hides destined for Italy at
Mombasa.

In view of the arrangement concluded with the
Italian Government, of which you were informed in the
Foreign Office letter of the 15th instant, there would
seem to be no objection to the unrestricted export of
light hides in normal quantities of preceding years
from British Colonial ports to Italy in the future
so far as local requirements permit. I am to suggest
that instructions in this sense should be given to
the proper authorities in order to obviate the neces-
sity
