Sir,

With reference last to your note of June 14th 1915, no. 74171, concerning the arrest of Messrs. Krulder and Winkelman at Mombasa, I have the honour to inform you, in accordance with instructions received, that Mr. Krulder is of opinion that through his arrest, he has suffered a loss of 3000 guilders, because owing to this, it was impossible for him to renew for half a year his situation with the "Centraal Afrikaansche Handel Maatschappij".

On examination it has appeared to the Minister of Foreign Affairs at The Hague that the amount stated by Mr. Krulder is not too high and that he can be considered to have really suffered this loss.
