and states not disposed to adopt suggestions made

when the local C.C. reported
recommending well for: the guarantee
Wellington: £100. a month with
certain additions. The off. asked
the S.O.S. to ascertain the
position in regard to funds raised
in England for his benefit; the
intention being, on receipt of this
info, to move the adoption of the
report in Leg. Co.

The info obtained (the
S.O.S. was met in London & Ross'
soc' had raised a sum of £13. 12-4
& that Mr. McGregor Ross in
addition to considerable initial
contributions had received promises
of annual ~~etc~~ subscriptions of
£52. 16. 0 a year: It was

concluded unlike what the Govt. guarantee
of £100 a month would
~~not~~ become operative, & Mr. McGregor

Ross suggests that the Kings
Post should make an out-2-out
grant of £36 a year leaving

to Matthew Wellington could assume.

3. The Committee has reported
~~against varying~~ ¹⁹
~~that they are not prepared to vary the~~

recommendation contained in the last

paragraph of the report of which a

copy was sent to you in the letter

from this Department of the 7th

¹⁹³⁰ October. This recommendation was

as follows:-

"That Government should guarantee
to Matthew Wellington an income
of at least Shs.60/- per month
for the rest of his life, together
with additional payments as and
when necessary to cover the
maintenance of the house and furniture,
purchase of clothes and provision of
medical attendance, medicines and
medical comforts".

The Committee also state that they
are not only satisfied that their

their recommendation meets all
requirements, but they are
convinced that Matthew Wellington
is himself satisfied that that
is the case.

The Committee add that the
site upon which Matthew Wellington
and his daughter and son-in-law
reside is freehold property
belonging to them and there
is therefore no question of

My Lord,

I have the honour to refer to Your
No. 35 or 15728/29
Lordship's despatch No. 831 of the 23rd October
1930, transmitting copies of correspondence with
Mr. MacGregor Ross and the London Missionary
Society regarding funds raised for the benefit of
Matthew Wellington. On the receipt of Your
Lordship's despatch I instructed the Treasurer,
as Chairman of the Select Committee of Legislative
Council appointed to consider what form the
compassionate allowance to Matthew Wellington could
best assume, to call a meeting of that Committee
for the purpose of considering the suggestions put
forward by Mr. MacGregor Ross. That Committee has
reported that it sees no reason to vary the
recommendation contained in the last paragraph of
this report which was transmitted to Your Lordship
under cover of my despatch No. 551 of the 28th
August 1930, viz:- "That Government should guarantee
to Matthew Wellington an income of at least Shs. 60/-
per month for the rest of his life together with
additional payments as and when necessary to cover
the maintenance of the house and furniture, purchase
of clothes and provision of medical attendance,
medicines and medical comforts."

2. The Committee wishes to add the following comments on certain points raised by Mr. MacGregor Ross in his letter of the 16th October, addressed to the Under Secretary of State for the Colonies:-
 NO. 32 on 15/12/29

"Para. 3 of Mr. MacGregor Ross' letter. The statement of remittances set out by Mr. MacGregor Ross is correct. It will be observed that the draft for £40 was remitted to Matthew Wellington personally through the National Bank of India, Mombasa, on the 23rd July 1930, which was the date upon which the report of the Committee was signed. The Committee were unaware of this and feel that it is no help to the old man to hand him personally so large a sum which would certainly be dissipated in a few weeks.

The funds in the hands of the Trustees on the 31st December last were

Current Account	Shs. 1210.27.
Deposit Account	Shs. <u>2000.00</u> .
	Shs. <u>3210.27.</u>

which, if payment was made at the rate of Shs. 60/- per month, will last for four years and five months.

Paragraph 8 of Mr. MacGregor Ross' letter. The Committee are not only satisfied that their recommendation will meet all requirements but they are convinced that Matthew Wellington is himself satisfied that that is the case.

Paragraph 10 of Mr. MacGregor Ross' letter. The site upon which Matthew Wellington and his daughter and son-in-law reside is freehold property belonging to them and there is, therefore, no question of eviction."

3. In view of the Select Committee's report I

am not disposed to adopt either of the suggestions
made by Mr. MacGregor Ross.
