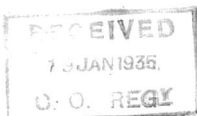

Sir,

With reference to Lord Passfield's despatch No. 309 of the 11th May, 1931, I have the honour to recommend the grant of pensionable status to Mr. Mbarak Ali Hinawy, Arab Assistant to the District Commissioner, Mombasa, as personal to himself, with effect from the date of his first appointment, viz. 22nd May, 1918. It is proposed that the normal age of retirement in this case shall be 55 years and that as the Non-European Officers' Pensions Ordinance, 1932, does not apply to Mr. Mbarak, his pension on retirement shall be assessed under the Superannuation Regulations.

2. Mr. Mbarak was engaged as Assistant to the Chairman of the Coast Arbitration Board on the 22nd May, 1918, and served in that capacity until 1921 when he was appointed Deputy Chairman. In 1922 the work of Land Arbitration came to an end and Mr. Mbarak was appointed as from the 1st of January, 1922, to the newly created post of Arab Assistant to the District Commissioner, Mombasa, at a salary of £300 per annum consolidated. This salary was raised to £325 per annum on the 1st of January, 1927, and subsequently to £343 per annum on the 1st January, 1930.

3. Since his appointment to his present post Mr. Mbarak has proved himself a valuable assistant to the various District Commissioners who have from time to time been in charge of Mombasa, and in all the circumstances, therefore, I trust that your approval of my recommendation will not be withheld.

4. Provision has been made in Item 114, Head II, Draft Estimates 1935, for his salary to be increased to £360 per annum consolidated with effect from the 1st January, 1935.
