With reference to your letter No. 38078/37 dated 5th May 1937, I am commanded by the Army Council to inform you that No. 7257728 Sergeant A. Callaway, Royal Army Medical Corps, who is at present serving with No. 13 Company Royal Army Medical Corps, Edinburgh, has been recommended for employment as a dispenser and X-ray attendant with the Medical Department of Kenya, subject to the conditions and instructions relating to the employment of British soldiers in Colonial service.

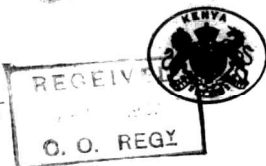

COLONY AND PROTECTORATE OF KENYA.Particulars of the Office of Dispenser and X-Ray Attendant,
Medical Department, Kenya.

1. Duties of office and qualifications required for their performance.

- (1) Dispensing and supervision of a Dispensary.
- (11) May be required to assist in training of Native Dispensers.
- (111) Should be capable of working and looking after the X-ray plant at a Native Hospital. Should have a knowledge of developing X-Ray photographs, etc.

Qualifications. R.A.M.C.,
Certificate for Dispenser.

Course of training in X-Ray work.

Candidate to be unmarried.

2. Salary of office.

£360 x £20 to £480 x £20 to £540.

3. Allowances, quarters and other circumstances affecting the value of the office.

Free quarters will not be provided, but Government reserves to itself the right to order any officer to occupy Government quarters and to pay rent therefor, as under:-

7½% of the actual salary when the salary exceeds £360 p.a.
10% of the actual salary when the salary exceeds £520 p.a.
Accommodation can usually be found in a mess or a boarding house, the inclusive expenses of such may be estimated at between £8 and £10 a month.

4. Accommodation, etc.

Should the candidate occupy Government quarters, the monthly rates, fuel, light, water, etc., may be estimated at not more than £3 a month.

5. Passage, etc.

Free ~~return~~ passage will be provided to and from the Colony.

6 Leave.

On completion of the term of service leave will be granted, on full pay, at the rate of 10 days for each completed 3 months of resident service. In addition, 18 days leave may be taken annually.
