Sir Jacob Bath now reiterates the word "conditions", and apparently wishes the rule as to not marrying to be made rigid. There are obvious objections to laying down any exclusive rule on this point, and I suggest that we should point this out to the local Government, saying them, while the secretary of State does not consider it advisable to make it a definition condition of appointment that an officer should not marry within his first two tours of service, steps will be taken, as in the past, to inform all the candidates for appointment as Cadet Officers in the Kenya Police that in the opinion of the local Government, it is considered undesirable that they should marry during the first two thours of service.

If this course of action is agreed to, members of the Claifest Section of the East African Dapartanes, and # Private Secretaries (Appintments) should see for guidance in case of future of vacancies.
