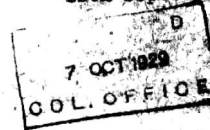

The Colonial Secretary of the Colony

LEGAL REPORT

THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTRATION (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1929.

This Bill provides for the appointment of an additional official to be called the Principal Registrar who will perform administrative functions on behalf of the Registrar General in addition to being Registrar for the Masrobi area.

This appointment is necessitated by the fact that the Principal Ordinance is very largely concerned with the registration of the Births and Deaths of natives of the colony, with a view to statistics being available as to the rise and fall of the native population, and the whole of the material concerning the vital statistics of the native population, which is, needless to say, by far the largest part of the population of the colony is contained in the office of the Chief Registrar of Natives. It is considered desirable, therefore, that in these circumstances, the Chief Registrar of Natives should have the administrative working of the Principal Ordinance, under the supervision of the Registrar General. Accordingly this Bill creates the post of Principal Registrar.

Clauses 2 and 7 make the Medical Officer of Health the person to whom weekly statements of births and deaths shall be sent by Registrars.

Clauses 4 and 5 make provision, in accordance with the recently adopted practice in England, for the actual certificate of cause of death, which may contain confidential matter, to be forwarded to the Registrar direct.

**An Ordinance to Amend the Births and Deaths
Registration Ordinance, 1928.**

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya,
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "the Births and Deaths Registration (Amendment) Ordinance, 1929," and shall be read as one with the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, 1928, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Ordinance."

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the addition of the following definition:—

"'Medical Officer of Health' means a Medical Officer of Health appointed under the provisions of the Public Health Ordinance, or any other Ordinance, to carry out the duties of Medical Officer of Health in any area."

3. The following section shall be inserted as section 15 of the Principal Ordinance:—

" 3A. The Governor shall appoint a Principal Registrar of Births and Deaths for the Colony, who in addition to performing the duties of a Registrar, and carrying out such instructions as may be issued by the Registrar General, shall have such duties and powers as may be prescribed."

4. The following section shall be inserted as section 16A of the Principal Ordinance:—

" 16A. (1) In the case of the death of any person who has been attended during his last illness by a registered or licensed medical practitioner, that practitioner shall sign a certificate stating to the best of his knowledge and belief the cause of death.

(2) Every such certificate of cause of death shall be forwarded forthwith by the medical practitioner by whom it is signed to the Registrar, and the medical practitioner, on signing a certificate as aforesaid shall give in the form prescribed by the Rules to some person required by this Ordinance to give information concerning the death, notice in writing of the signing of the certificate.

(3) Where an inquest is held on the body of any deceased person a medical certificate of the cause of death need not be forwarded to the Registrar, but the magistrate holding the inquest shall send to the Registrar a copy of his finding, which shall be sufficient.

(4) Every medical practitioner who refuses or fails without reasonable excuse to comply with any of the provisions of this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds."

5. Sub-section (1) of section 17 is hereby amended by the insertion, following the word "death" in the fourth line thereof, of the following words:—

or upon production to him at such time of notice in writing signed by a medical practitioner, in the form prescribed by the Rules, that such a certificate has been signed."

6. Sub-section (2) of section 17 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended and the following sub-section substituted therefor:—

"(2) If the cause does not appear from such enquiries to be one to which section 131 or section 143 of the Criminal Procedure Ordinance applies, the magistrate or police officer or other person as aforesaid shall report accordingly to the Registrar who shall issue a permit for the interment or other disposal of the body."

7. Section 22 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended and the following section substituted therefor:—

" 22. It shall be the duty of every Registrar, at the close of each week, to forward to the Medical Officer of Health in whose area his registration area is situated, and to the Statistician, a statement of the births and deaths registered by him during such week."

Passed in the Legislative Council the thirteenth day of June in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine.
