We have now to inform Crown Agents of his appointment and decide what allowances he is to receive. The letter I passed to him on 6th October rather commits us to giving him some allowances, but nothing has been said to him as to what they are to be. On the whole I think we had better pay him exactly the same as the other candidates i.e. £50 per term plus £8 as a non-Oxford or Cambridge man plus £20 for the London course minus the amount of salary he receives for the period from the beginning of the Cambridge term to the end of the London course.

The proposal on file 25386/WA to allow officers who may attend the T.A.S. course during leave — a single allowance of 5/- has been agreed to by Mr. Bottomley and Mr. Green. But under para. 31 of Afr. 973, such officers are "normally" allowed 5/- lodging allow. + 5/- training allow. I do not know why in principle it should be thought necessary to distinguish between the T.A.S. course and any other course.

E. A. M. S. officers (to whom para. 31 of Afr. 973 does not apply) do not receive a training allowance when taking a T.M. course during leave as a condition of confirmation. This has always seemed to me to be anomalous, but as no one has ever protested and as doctors are, more generously treated than other officers as regards study leave I have refrained from raising the point.

So far as the T.A.S. course is concerned, I think we should abide by the rule in Afr. 973.

I understand that the minutes on this
file proposing to grant any necessary extension

Such cases will of course in future be
infrequent, but I think that nearly every
selection we will have a few cases of
officers from such depts. as Police, Customs, Accounts
etc. related for administrative. The case which
has arisen is a Produce Inspector in Wigan
drawing £400 a year. Such officers are required
to take the T.A.S. Course to qualify themselves
for an administrative appt. Their full
pay leave will normally cover only a small
part of the course, and if they are given a
full pay extension to cover the whole course,
